An ever-changing business environment has imposed new demands on electric cooperative directors, requiring increased knowledge of changes in the electric utility business, new governance skills, and a solid knowledge of the cooperative principles and business model. Continued education and training help directors stay abreast industry changes and informed to make decisions in the best interest of the members.

NRECA's CCD program requires attendance and demonstrated understanding of the basic competencies contained in five core courses: Director Duties and Liabilities; Understanding the Electric Business; Board operations and Process; Strategic Planning; and Financial Decision Making.

Additionally, 12 employees and four members of the Committee on Nominations and Qualifications completed the program to gain further understanding of the board of director's duties.
