Prioritize Safety Year-Round

May is Electrical Safety Month

At Tri-County Electric Co-op, we recognize Electrical Safety Month every May, but we also know the importance of practicing safety year-round. From our co-op crews to you, the member-owners we serve, we recognize that everyone has a part to play in prioritizing safety. 800682593

Electricity is an integral part of modern life. Given the prevalence of electrical devices, tools and appliances, here are a few practical electrical safety tips:

- Frayed wires pose a serious safety hazard. Power cords can become damaged or frayed from age, heavy use or excessive current flow through the wiring. If cords become frayed or cut, replace them, as they could cause a shock when handled.
- ► Avoid overloading circuits. Overload happens when you draw more electricity than a circuit can safely handle—by having too many devices running on one circuit. 800764663
- ▶ Label circuit breakers. Knowing which breaker powers each circuit helps to understand the circuits in your home.
- ▶ Use extension cords properly. Never plug an extension cord into another extension cord, which could lead to overheating creating a potential fire hazard. Extension cords should not be used as permanent solutions. If you need additional outlets, contact a licensed electrician to help. 8001134701


