It's time for the 2022 Election and Annual Meeting

2022 Election

All members are eligible to vote in the election regardless of their director district.

Election

- ▶ Every member can vote in the election, regardless of where you reside.
- ▶ Director districts 5, 7 and 9 will be on the ballot. 31339002
- ▶ Members who vote by the deadline will receive a \$25 bill credit and will be entered into the door prize drawing at Annual Meeting.
- ► Members may vote online, through email or by mail.
- ▶ Your official election ballot will come on the back of the September *Texas Co-op Power* magazine don't throw away your chance to win!
- ► Members with a valid email address will receive an email with your specific voting credentials.
- ▶ Voting opens September 1 and closes at 5 p.m. on September 28.

Why is my bill higher than last summer?

There are four main reasons members are experiencing higher electric bills.

- ▶ Increase in natural gas prices. Natural gas is the predominant fuel source for electric generation in Texas, and the cost per MMBtu has nearly tripled from this time last year. Higher natural gas prices equate to higher costs for electricity.
- ▶ Record Heat. Texas summers are hot. But the summer of 2022 will go down in history as one of the hottest, and driest, summers in history. The north Texas region experienced more than 40 days of triple-digit heat. 3102001
- ▶ Increased Electric Use. When it is as hot as it was this summer, your air conditioner, the largest electric user in your home, must work overtime. Members consumed 22% more electricity this summer (May-July) than the same period in 2021, with the average residential member consuming 1,670 kWh per month. Higher consumption creates a higher electric bill.
- ▶ ERCOT Reform. ERCOT has switched to a "reliability model," creating more power reserves available than in the past. These market modifications were implemented to avoid tragedies, like Winter Storm Uri, in the future. These changes are not free and unfortunately come at a cost which is eventually borne by Texas consumers. 8000998501

Monitoring electric use is a key component to managing electric costs. Energy-saving tips are available at tcectexas.com/energy-efficiency. Members can track daily electric consumption on TCEC Connect, the online member portal, or enroll in daily electric use notifications.

Tri-County Electric Cooperative continues to be competitive. Our all-in rate for 2,000 kWh is 14.575 cents/kWh compared to the average retail electric provider's cost of 17.2 cents/kWh, according to Power to Choose.

Strawberry Surprise Muffins

1 egg

1 cup sugar

4 tablespoons melted butter

1/2 cup sour cream

1/2 cup milk

2 cups flour

1 tablespoon baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

1 1/2 cup fresh strawberries, diced

6-8 large, fresh sage leaves, minced

In a large bowl, whisk the egg and sugar

until creamy. Add melted butter. Whisk in sour cream and milk until batter texture is uniform. Don't over mix.

In another bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder and salt. Add strawberries and sage leaves, stirring gently. Add strawberry mixture into the wet mixture. Gently fold until just combined. Batter will be thick.

Line a muffin tin with paper cups. Spoon mixture into each cup and fill to the top.

Bake at 350°F for 25-30 minutes until the tops are golden brown and a toothpick comes out clean when inserted into the middle of the muffin.
