See if you Qualify for Electric Bill Help:

At Tri-County Electric Cooperative, our mission is to take care of our member-owners. During these times of financial and economic uncertainty, we want to ensure our members are aware of programs and organizations within the state that can help ease the burden of billing statements, including Brazos Hardship Fund assistance program, Texas Utility Help, and Texas 211.

The Brazos Electric Ratepayer Hardship Fund assistance program is available to eligible, low-income residential members to assist with recovery costs related to the Brazos Financing Rider - which covers Tri-County Electric Co-op's portion of Brazos Winter Storm Uri and Brazos Bankruptcy costs. 800782489

Texas Utility Help and Tri-County Electric Co-op have partnered to offer eligible Texas households the opportunity to apply for energy and water bill assistance through an application process. Application qualifications for Texas Utility Help apply to renters and homeowners whose household income is at or below 150% of Federal Poverty Income Guidelines and at least one occupant in the household is a U.S. citizen or qualified alien. Texas Utility Help gives priority to households who have had services disconnected or are at risk of services being disconnected.

Texas 211 is a program of the Texas Health and Human Services Commission which helps connect people with the services they need. Anyone can call 211 or visit 211texas.org to access the plethora of services provided, grouped into 12 different categories. A notable service is the "Utility Expenses" option, where Texans can select from different utility expenses to receive financial assistance from organizations. Simply find your zip code to view the various organizations who help to aid. There are different requirements depending on the organization. 9120100001
