fire looks nice, it's not as safe as a slower, steadier burn.

• Open fireplace doors: Glass doors are meant to keep drafts out when there's no fire, but can shatter if exposed to high heat. Open them, and use a screen while burning.

Avoid clutter: Don't put flammable items near the fireplace. That includes trees, stockings or garlands.

**Keep it clean:** Between fires, scoop up cool ashes and place them in a metal

container. NEVER toss out hot ashes.
